| TRAUMA EXPOSURE RESPONSE & SELF-CARE | This training is based on the book Trauma Stewardship: An Everyday Guide to Caring for Self While Caring for Others by Laura van Dernoot Lipsky with Connie Burk (2009). In this training, participants will learn about the 16 warning signs of trauma exposure response, reflect on how their exposure to and experience of trauma influences the way they serve families, and identify important components of an effective self-care practice.
