Advanced Listing Search

Youth Investment Center

The Youth Investment Center program utilizes 40 AmeriCorps members as Youth Mentors and Volunteer Coordinators to assist foster youth in achieving academic success and developing life skills necessary for successful transition to adulthood. Outcomes for emancipated foster youth are bleak, tracking well below statewide results in high school completion, obtaining employment, and securing housing arrangements. However, foster youth are capable of achieving success in adulthood if they learn essential life skills, and AmeriCorps members will provide life skill activities to foster youth to prepare them for their transition towards a successful adulthood. Members are recruited from diverse neighborhoods and reflect the ethnic and socioeconomic profile of those they serve. YIC will also recruit foster care alumni using existing connections with the local high school, county agencies, and group homes. The use of former foster youth as AmeriCorps members will enrich the program by bringing diverse life experiences and knowledge of the foster care system into the pool of members.

Member Duties : AmeriCorps members will provide life skills to youth (including foster youth) to prepare them for their transition toward a successful adulthood. They will work directly with youth providing a variety of interactions: after-school tutoring; mentoring meetings; workshops, and engagement in Project-Based Learning projects; all of which have been intentionally structured to build the skills the youth need to learn, including academics, communication, team building, and leadership. AmeriCorps members will serve as mentors to youth (including those who will serve as Youth Advocates and act as liaisons between current foster youth and the community). Members will guide youth development activities that build resilience and will provide life skill activities to prepare the foster youth adulthood. Members may also serve as Volunteer Coordinators who will recruit and support one-time and long-term community volunteers who will be engaged in activities with the youth.

Program Benefits : Childcare assistance if eligible , Health Coverage , Living Allowance , Training , Education award upon successful completion of service , Loan Forebearance .

Terms :
Prohibits paid work outside of the sponsoring agency at any time , Uniforms provided and required , Car recommended .

Service Areas :
Homelessness , Community Outreach , Education , Housing , Children/Youth , Community and Economic Development .

Skills :
Education , Writing/Editing , Teaching/Tutoring , Public Speaking , General Skills , Leadership , Social Services , Conflict Resolution , Team Work , Counseling , Communications , Youth Development , Fine Arts/Crafts , Recruitment , Community Organization .
